Located on the historic Main Street of Newmarket, The Elman W. Campbell Museum was once the North York Registry Office in 1884. We are dedicated to the preservation, interpretation and education of local artifacts that relate to the history and development of the Town of Newmarket and its environs since the 1880s.

Educational School Programs

Field Study Programs at the Museum JK to Grade 3 | Duration: 1.5 to 2 hours

We offer a variety of engaging and fun school programs for students and teachers that relate to the Ontario School Curriculum, and promote inquisitive learning skills. Led by our Program Instructor, students will learn through using artifacts to engage, explore, investigate and communicate.

Cost: \$3.50 per student | Minimum 12 to maximum 30 students per class. Accompanying adults free of charge.

Field Study Programs at the Museum

JK & SK: Early Playtime in Historic Newmarket | 1.5 hours Year-round except December

Go back in time and experience life as early settlers and engage in play-based learning with old-fashioned toys and colouring.
Students will learn: How to use their senses to explore everyday objects from the past to learn about the value of a museum and its connection to the community.

Grade 1: Local Community and Elman W. Campbell Museum 1.5 hours | Year-round except December

Why do we have museums? What kinds of artifacts are collected? What does a curator do? Students will become a mini-curator handling artifacts and extrapolating information from historical objects and maps.

Students will learn: The role and responsibilities of a curator, the purpose of a museum and its relationship with local community.

Grade 2: Winter Celebrations in Victorian Newmarket 2 hours | Late November to December only.

Explore traditions in 3 different families during Victorian times: Rogers (Quaker), Roe (Anglo-Saxon), Sutherland (Scottish). This program will end with a take-home craft.

Students will learn: How to use objects to increase their understanding of different historical cultures and traditions.

Grade 3: Early Settlers in Newmarket 1.5 hours | Year-round except December

Discover the daily life of pioneers, their challenges, and responsibilities of men, women and children. This program will end with a take-home craft.

Students will learn: How to use their inquisitive skills to interpret historical objects to understand about people, places and roles.
