The Post Office.

We receive the communication, or rather queries of our correspondent Ignoramus, with much pleasure. The present mail arrangement between Newmarket and Toronto is most inconvenient to business men, and loudly demands some improvement tending to the benefit of those chiefly interested. As our correspondent remarks, it is a grievance of no trifling nature, that three days should be occapied in writing to the County Town and receiving an answer .--Thoro seems no good and sufficient reason why Nowmarket should not have two mails a day as well as Barrie, which is tearedly its equal in commercial importance. And we are persuaded that the evil will be promptly temedied when brought under the notice of the proper authority. With the convenionce afforded by the Railroad, the differonce in the expense of the service will be but slight, while the advantage to this community will be very great. For ourselves we can speak strongly on the inconvenience of having to despatch letters for the English mail some forty-eight hours before it is made up in Toronto. However, as much boast is made that the department is carefully worked for the accommodation of the public, we fancy there will perhaps be little disinclination shown to afford us this boon.
