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# 2017 Capital Carry-overs Information Report

#### Executive Summary

#### Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide information related to the 2017 Capital Carryovers.

#### Background

The 2017 capital expenditures budget including carry-overs totaled \$65,792,834. The actual expenditures were \$17,362,883; including \$1,202,568 for fire vehicle and equipment replacement, \$2,149,425 for RJT facility improvement, \$1,106,673 for artificial turf, \$2,009,377 for stormwater management projects and \$5,293,382 for road projects. A balance of \$46,247,084 is to be carried over: \$43,614,420 into 2018, and \$2,632,664 into 2019. A net amount of \$2,182,867 is not being carried over due to cancelled projects and project savings. Total carry-over requests to 2018 amount to \$51,401,709, of which \$7,787,289 was carry-over requests to 2018 allocated at the end of year 2016.

Carry-overs are the transfer of the unspent portion of capital budgets, to the following year. As such, the expenditures and financing already have Council approval. The budget amounts carried over are combined with the "new" budget amounts and are reported on the financial statements.

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Capital projects may be incomplete for a number of reasons, such as:

- 1) A multi-year project may have had all of its' budget allocated to one year
- 2) There can be delays in getting approvals, external funding, utility or Regional clearances, or in awarding tenders
- 3) Re-prioritization

To begin the transition towards multi-year budgeting, carry-overs have been assigned to the year in which the project is reasonably projected to be undertaken. For this reason, starting in 2017, carry-overs have been allocated to multiple future years.

Major projects carried over to 2018 include:

- Road pavement, rehabilitation, and reconstruction projects \$11,544,714;
- Water meter replacement program \$9,845,966;
- Water & wastewater servicing study implementation- \$1,295,283;
- New parks development \$2,967,579;
- Community splash pad \$1,023,761;
- Fire Station 4-5 Design & Construction \$3,687,761;
- Fire trucks replacement \$1,746,000;
- Fire Station 4-1 barrier and renovation \$1,206,494;
- Land use and building tracking system \$1,000,000

Major projects carried over to 2019 include:

• Fire Station 4-5 construction - \$2,449,056

### Discussion

Based on the carryovers, the capital program for 2018 would be over \$106 million. \$29 million of this relates to the Mulock Farm land purchase. Staff will give its best effort to deliver on the remaining \$77 million in a timely manner, but to do it all within the current calendar year is problematic.

Measures to implement multi-year capital budgeting are being developed but are not in place yet. These measures include more detailed Asset Management Plans and an Asset Replacement Fund Strategy (see Financial Services Report 2018-12).

Although it is foreseeable that the \$106 million program will not be completed in 2018, the tools are not in place to determine which projects will go forward and which will not. For this reason, a blanket unallocated deferral of a further \$50 million is being applied to 2018. This should make the capital program more achievable and in line with historical capacity trends. The blanket deferral does not negate previously approved funding.

As a result, better-informed investment decisions can be made.

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# Conclusion

Throughout the year, there will be quarterly reports to keep Members of Council and SLT apprised of the Capital Carry-over figures.

# Consultation

# **Budget Impact**

#### Capital Budget

An amount of \$51,401,709 is to be carried over into 2018 (\$7,787,289 from 2016 and \$43,614,420 from 2017) and \$2,632,664 is to be carried over to 2019. Funding is available for these carry-overs in accordance with the original budget. The following table summarizes the approved capital budgets allocated by year:
