Dear Minister Hardeman,

Ontario farms have come under increasing threat from trespassers and activists who illegally enter property, barns and buildings, causing significant disruptions to the entire agri-food sector. These activists are trespassing under false pretenses to gain entry on to farm properties. They have seized private property and threatened the health and safety of Ontario farms, employees, livestock and crops. These individuals and organizations are causing health and safety concerns and undue stress to Ontario farmers, their families, and their businesses. Once peaceful protests have escalated to trespassing, invading, barn break-ins and harassment. These incidents distress farmers, their families and employees, and threaten the health of livestock and crops when activists breach biosecurity protocols, ultimately putting the entire food system at risk.

We strongly support the new proposed legislation, *Bill 156: Security from Trespass and Protecting Food Safety Act.* This new legislation is an important way to keep our farm and food supply safe for all Ontarians. Bill 156 provides a balanced approach to protecting farms while recognizing a citizen's right to protest. This new legislation will ensure farm businesses have a legal standing to protect their farm, family and employees, livestock, crops and ultimately the entire food system. Bill 156: *Security from Trespass and Protecting Food Safety Act* is good news for Ontario's agrifood industry.

Thank you for this important new legislation. Protection of our Ontario Agriculture should be the highest priority.


Whereas the Province of Ontario is currently reviewing the mandate and operations of Conservation Authorities; and

Dear Prime Minister:

Re: Grey County Council Resolution Supporting 100% Canadian Wines Excise Exemption

At the March 12, 2020 session of Grey County Committee of the Whole, resolution CW60-20 was passed by Grey County Council as follows:

Whereas, Canada's federal excise tax currently exempts 100% Canadian wines; and

Whereas, Australia has asked the World Trade Organization (WTO) to rule that this exemption is discriminatory; and

Whereas, if the WTO were to rule with Australia, Canadian wineries making 100% Canadian wine would no longer be exempt; and

Whereas, the present value of the excise exemption is \$39 million annually across Canada; and

Whereas, in the 13 years since this exemption was created, the production of 100% Canadian wine has increased by almost 30 million litres, representing an additional annual contribution of \$2.7 billion to the Canadian economy; and

Whereas, Grey County, specifically the municipalities of Meaford and Town of Blue Mountains, is home to a number of successful, award winning, boutique wineries;

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved That, the County of Grey supports the excise exemption for 100% Canadian wines; and

That, the County of Grey appeals to the Federal government to ensure the exemption remains in place by reaching an agreement with Australia prior to the WTO ruling; and

That, this motion be forwarded to: The Right Honourable Justin Trudeau, Prime Minister of Canada; The Honourable Andrew Scheer, Leader of the Official Opposition; Yves-François Blanchet, Leader of the Bloc Québécois; Jagmeet Singh, Leader of the New Democratic Party of Canada; Jo-Ann Roberts, Interim Leader of the Green Party of Canada; The Honourable Mary Ng, Minister of Small Business, Export Promotion, and International Trade; Alex Ruff, Member of Parliament for Bruce-Grey-Owen Sound; AMO Member Municipalities; FCM Member Municipalities; Vintner's Quality Alliance; Ontario Craft Wineries; Ontario Craft Cider Association; and

That this resolution be forwarded prior to County Council approval as per Section 25.6 of Procedural By-law 5003-18.

Whereas the World Health Organization has declared the COVID-19 Virus a world-wide pandemic; and

Whereas all levels of Government in Canada are taking precautionary measures to help protect their citizens and communities and slow the spread of this virus; and

Whereas these measures include social distancing and avoiding where possible public gatherings; and

Whereas the duration of these measures is unknown at this time; and

Whereas municipal governments need to continue to operate; and

Whereas the technology exists to allow Council members to participate in meetings electronically and for the public to be able to view the proceedings of Council electronically, thus allowing for increased social distancing without compromising accountability and transparency of Council decisions; and

Whereas the Municipal Act currently provides for Council Members to participate electronically in meetings, but only if a quorum is present in person and the meeting is open to the public; and

Whereas additional measures to control the COVID-19 pandemic could be employed if the Provincial Government waives the quorum and closed session restrictions to electronic participation in meetings by Council Members;

Now therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the Municipality of Callander petition the Provincial Government to waive the restrictions on electronic participation in Council Meetings, at least for the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic;

And further that copies of this motion be sent to the Premier of Ontario, the Minister of Municipal Affairs; our local MPP; and all Ontario Municipalities for support.

RE: Provincially Stranded Assets

Please be advised the above-noted matter was placed before Council at its meeting held on March 24, 2020, and the following resolution was passed:

WHEREAS GO rail services and 400-series highways are amongst the most significant infrastructure to support growth & competitiveness in York Region; and

WHEREAS Provincial policies encourage future mixed uses development in Strategic Growth Areas and support employment growth along highways; and

WHEREAS there are major opportunities for transit-oriented development for York Region, specifically for the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville and the City of Richmond Hill with the opening of Gormley and Bloomington GO stations by the Highway 404 lands; and

WHEREAS a significant amount of lands near Gormley & Bloomington GO stations and along the Highway 404 are designated "countryside" and protected mainly for agricultural uses; and

WHEREAS much of the lands protected for agricultural uses near the GO stations are no longer viable for normal farm operations; and

WHEREAS overly protecting lands from development suppresses York Region's competitive opportunity in the GTHA and restricts Provincial investments and significant economic development opportunities; and

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WHEREAS there is an apparent need to further assess the lands surrounding all Provincially Stranded Assets in York Region to determine their best uses; and

WHEREAS Whitchurch-Stouffville Council resolved on December 11, 2018 requesting the Province to consider some of the stranded lands in the Highway 404 corridor Provincially Significant Employment Zone; and

WHEREAS the City of Richmond Hill Council at its meeting on February 26, 2020 also directed staff to review the current land use designation near the Gormley GO station and along the Highway 404 corridor for future development; and

WHEREAS York Region Council at its meeting on March 21, 2019, unanimously passed a resolution to support Whitchurch-Stouffville's position for the Highway 404 corridor lands; and

WHEREAS growing employment opportunities, attracting people and businesses, and increasing access to efficient transportation options are the objectives of the current York Region Council to increase economic prosperity; and

WHEREAS only the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing can decide on a change of use for the stranded lands.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Whitchurch-Stouffville Council request York Region Council to direct York Region staff to identify the suggested Provincially Stranded Assets in this resolution and report back on the competitive benefits to the Region and local municipalities if land designations were to be changed in the future; and

THAT Council request York Region to formally request the Province to redesignate lands at the Gormley and Bloomington GO stations on both sides of the Highway 404 corridor from "countryside" to "urban settlement area"; and

THAT Council request York Region Council to ask the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing to permit the new land use designations within the applicable Provincial plans; and

THAT this Council resolution be forwarded to all York Region's Councils, York Regional Council, York Regional MPP's, the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing & the Premier for their information.
