PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY FROM RODENTS

Rodents like rats and mice are common pests in the GTA that affect all municipalities. **Follow these simple tips to protect your property from rodents:**

1. Do not leave food (or pet food) outside that will attract rodents and wildlife.
2. Store garbage and waste in animal-resistant containers.
3. If composting, keep the compost contents moist, turn them regularly and try to bury the food scraps as deep as possible. Avoid putting organic food waste as this will attract rodents.
4. Remove clutter, debris, and wood piles as these are common areas that rodents use to seek shelter.
5. Cut tall grass and weeds around your property.
