PRIVATE TREE REMOVAL PERMIT

Property owners looking to remove a tree on private property are required to obtain a permit in accordance with the Town's Private Tree Protection By-law and pay the appropriate fees and charges associated with the removal. There are no fees for trees that are dead, dying, or hazardous, however a permit must still be obtained to remove the tree.

SUCCESSES OF NEWMARKET'S WATERMAIN REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

Newmarket's Water Meter Replacement Program has helped save 56,000 cubic meters of water over the last two years through a trial leak detection program. That's equivalent to 354,000 baths!

Once you receive a letter of eligibility, book an appointment with our contractor WAMCO as soon as possible. The new water meters will eliminate in-person water meter readings, increase efficiencies, and provide even better services to residents.

ANNUAL WATERMAIN CLEANING NEWMARKET

The Town's Annual Watermain Cleaning program is underway so we can continue to provide safe, high-quality water to residents. Unidirectional flushing (UDF) will be used to clean the watermains by flushing sequences of water from one hydrant to another. In most cases, you will not notice any change in service. However you may notice discolouration in the water and/or low water pressure. Discoloured water does not pose a health hazard. If this occurs, residents can run their faucets for a short time until the water is clear.

TIPS TO LEARN TO CO-EXIST WITH COYOTES

- Do not approach, touch, turn your back or run from coyotes.
- If approached by a coyote, pick up small children or pets. Back away while remaining calm, stand tall, wave your hands and make lots of noise.
- Do not feed coyotes or leave any type of food outdoors for any animal, even your pets (i.e. dog/cat food)
- Educate your children to not approach or harass any wild animals.
- Always keep pets on a short leash (6ft. or less).
- Don't leave small pets unattended near forested areas, including your backyard.

If the coyote poses an immediate and serious threat, call 9-1-1. Report coyote interactions to Animal Services at 905-895-5193 and press 3 if calling after-hours.
